

Sexual Abuse Includes (but is not limited to):

- Touching you or making you touch yourself or someone else without your consent (note – children do not have the ability to give consent to adults or individuals who are significantly older than they are, and power dynamics can decrease or eliminate ability to consent)
- Making you watch sexual acts
- Making you listen to or read sexual content (aimed at you or others)
- Exposing you to sexual material without your consent (note – exposing children to sexually explicit material is abuse)
- Breaching privacy boundaries with or without your knowledge (i.e., watching, photographing, or filming you without your knowledge and/or permission, sharing sexual photos of you as a minor or without your knowledge and/or permission)
- NOTE – not all child abuse comes from adults or even older children – children can abuse other children
